## Child's Artwork Expresses Deep Emotion

Artwork can tell stories or depict ideas but most importantly art stirs emotions. The artwork below was created by Nadia, a 6<sup>th</sup> grade student, in Rantlamouaie, Haiti. This beautiful drawing and its sentiments were drawn after the students enjoyed hot nutritious meals, sports activities, and craft projects—all things the children seldom have during school hours. To Love a Child also provided a portable water filtration system and installed a solar panel system to provide energy lights for the classrooms. Lighting will give the community abundant opportunities for adult education, bible study and additional student activities which could not be conducted in the dark. The school will also benefit from the gift of its first computer and digital camera as well as English-Creole dictionaries to expand their knowledge of the English language.

Appreciation for the work we do is seen throughout the community. In fact, each Saturday people gather to clear debris and widen a path to soon become a road suitable for motorized vehicles to use. It's amazing what a little bit of hope and friendship can do—**thank you for the donations that bring such joy and hope to these people.**

## 40' Sea Container Delivers Hope

It took 7 months to collect the items for the shipment .



It took a small army to sort, box, tape, label, inventory and load the container.



It took 18 days for the container to travel to Port au Prince, Haiti by land and then by sea. It took 30 days to clear the container from Customs.



They are still unpacking the 768 boxes of supplies and delivering the school desks, chairs, 55 gallon rain water collection drums, solar panels donated by GE, storage containers, soccer balls, wash basins, trash recepticals, wheel barrows, laundry baskets and 450 sterile 5 gallon containers for drinking water collection.

The shipment also contained a variety of food stuffs, first aid , personal hygiene, and school supplies as well as 2,000+ clean durable plastic drinking cups. Books donated by schools in Saratoga County were included in this massive shipment. In anticipation of the books arriving, the secondary school in Lascohobas was able to start a Terminal Class which gives students the opportunities and qualifications needed to enroll in University.

## February Mission Team Focuses on Long Term Projects to Last Generations

Five volunteers from the Capital District spent a busy eight days on the Central Plateau of Haiti in February. The trip included visiting the Orphanage of Good Will in Croix des Bouquet, Transfiguration School in Rantlamouaie, Ascension School in Pouly, St. Philippe School in Corosse and the Holy Spirit School in Lascohobas.

Tim Schmehl & Scott Underhill focused on the installation of a solar panel system, donated by GE, and lighting for the school in Rantlamouaie. They also conducted research to layout the plans for future water projects to include drilling wells, installing cisterns, installing gravity fed piping and building water filtration systems.

Other highlights of the trip included initiating a Maternal Health Program, conducting sports activities, providing meals, and involving the children in art projects. The team was blessed to be able to attend a beautiful wedding ceremony and reception as well as join the congregation in Corosse for Sunday church services.

As with every trip, the warmth, friendship and kindness that was extended to us was very appreciated. Each of us looks forward to our next trip and working with everyone to bring more supplies and services that will help these areas to become more self-sustaining.

## 50 Women Benefit from Maternal Health Program



In both Haiti and Zimbabwe there is a high rate of maternal mortality. To Love a Child (TLC) is taking measures to help with this situation and already has 50 women in Haiti benefiting from this program.

Working with registered nurses, mid-wives and health care workers, TLC is now providing prenatal vitamins to pregnant women. Since there is a high rate of home births we are providing "Bundles of Love" Birthing Kits. These kits contain simple supplies that are highly effective in keeping the birth environment clean and lowering the chances of infection. We are also providing "Bundles of Joy" Newborn Baby Kits which contain items needed for the baby during the first months of life.

TLC is also in the process of organizing a mobile health program to travel to our sites to provide vaccinations and immunizations.

We need more caring individuals to help us with this program. If you can sew let us know—we need small fabric drawstring bags and reusable menstrual pads to be made. Can you set up a collection spot at your work or church to collect items such as cloth diapers, maternity clothes, and onesies? 

